I would like to take a moment to remind everyone of the services offered by 311. You may download their app and use it to report encampments, trash and a variety of issues to be addressed by the City. It takes a minute to download and use.

Traffic Safety

A reminder to everyone to slow down and give yourself enough time to travel through the district. Especially during the wet weather. Our number one collision injury is a pedestrian struck while legally in a crosswalk. Please make sure to make eye contact with the driver, ensure their car has come to a complete stop and then proceed. Be careful!

The Department's Motorcycle officers have spent a lot of time in our district lately. This includes over 30 citations in the last couple of weeks for speeding in the Broadway Tunnel. We are spending more time there than in recent history. Our enforcement time varies and one never knows if their speed is on radar. Please let everyone know to slow down in the Broadway Tunnel. We are starting to increase enforcement as well at Clay and Kearny.

In addition, Sergeant O'Mahony on the midnight watch has been leading a team of officers conducting Lidar enforcement (new version of radar) for speeding vehicles. We are serious about vehicles slowing down in the district.

Cell Phone Thefts

One of my newest readers of the newsletter, a retired Inspector from the SFPD, gave me a great reminder about a message to everyone. When a person is walking down the street, there is a possibility their cell phone could be taken right out of their hand. The problem doesn't just involve having to spend a small fortune getting a new phone and fixing the service but the person is now exposed to identify theft. In other words, the suspect has access to your personal information and there is a possibility that other problems related to expenditures and credit will occur shortly thereafter. The bottom line is to safeguard your phone by concealing it and not using while in public.

Great Arrest in Chinatown!

Over the last couple of years, I have stressed the importance of video cameras to provide an extra layer of protection for your home or business. I have numerous examples of cases where we have made an arrest based on an identification from the video. I have often thought if there was no video, there would be no case with a slim chance of apprehending a suspect.

This was the case this week in Chinatown where an individual was seen on camera on Waverly Alley breaking the glass door to a Family Association. When we saw the video, we instantly knew who it was. That day, Officer David On placed him under arrest and Sergeant Quoc Do did an incredible follow up investigation. As a result of their diligent work, we linked this suspect to a vandalism on Pagoda Alley as well.

Why this case was even easier to solve was because it was the same person arrested by Central Station Officers a few weeks ago when he randomly began kicking and badly damaging cars on Waverly Alley. We had a video of these incidents and as a result made the arrest. These are three cases of expensive vandalism which potentially would go unsolved without video. Something to consider?

Last, Central Station has essentially looked the same inside since it was built around 1968. Although we are going to keep the same color in the front office, I decided to change the color in the Assembly Room. I should have realized how hard it was to get 140 officers to agree on a color. Crimes of Note

Definitions

Robbery – Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

Assault – An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery - (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.
(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

*Assault is when a person swings their arm and battery is when that arm makes contact with another person.

Aggravated Assault – Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by any means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

Burglary – The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

Grand Theft – Grand theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

Petty Theft – Theft where the value of the property taken is less than \$950.

SAFE engages, educates, and empowers San Franciscans to build safer neighborhoods through crime prevention, education, and public safety services that result in stronger, more vibrant and resilient communities.

Our History

San Francisco SAFE, Inc. (Safety Awareness for Everyone) is a community crime prevention and public safety program that works in cooperation with the San Francisco Police Department and other city agencies to help San Franciscans protect themselves from becoming victims. SAFE was created in 1976 as a project of the SFPD. In 1980, SAFE became a non-profit 501(c)(3) corporation, and 30 years later, continues to act as the crime prevention component of the police department. A major portion of SAFE's income comes from a grant contract with the SFPD, but SAFE also receives donations and grants in order to expand and enhance our crime prevention and public safety services. SAFE has also received numerous grant awards from the City and County of San Francisco, the San Francisco Mayor's Office, State Office of Criminal Justice Planning and local foundations. We have provided major support to the San Francisco Police Department and Mayor's Office by acting as a fiscal agent for these federal and state funded grants, along with participating in numerous crime prevention activities as a part of these grants.

WHAT IS SAFE BIKES

If a bicycle is stolen, even if it is recovered, it is almost impossible to find the owner. Until now. SAFE Bikes is a community collaboration to help reduce bike theft in San Francisco and support bike owners getting their bikes back in the event that their bike is stolen. We have created a bicycle registry to help you get your bike back and to prove that the bike is yours. If your bike is recovered, officers can look up your serial number or registration tag number to return the bike to you. SAFE Bikes also hosts educational workshops and provides valuable information to help you lower the likelihood of your bike getting stolen.



IF YOUR BICYCLE IS STOLEN

- **STEP 1.** Go to your local police district station in San Francisco to file a police report, in person, online, or call 415-553-0123.
- **STEP 2.** Follow the steps listed here to increase your chances of getting your bicycle returned.
- **STEP 3.** Check the Stolen Bike Registry and Bike Index for your stolen bicycle.



LOCKING TECHNIQUE


- **STEP 1.** Secure rear wheel with small, hardened steel U-lock inside the rear triangle
- **STEP 2.** Make sure U-lock is secured to an immovable object
- **STEP 3.** Secondary metal lock (cable or another U-lock) placed on front wheel
- **STEP 4.** Replace quick release skewers with keyed locking skewers to ensure wheels and saddles are locked to frame.


