Captain Lazar's Message


Central Station's New Ping Yuen Housing Team!

We had an exciting week last week with our roll out of the first ever Housing Officer Team assigned to the Ping Yuen Housing Developments. One of the first public safety issues I focused on upon arriving at Central Station was the crime (reported and unreported) in the Ping Yuen.

As most of you know, the Ping Yuen was built in the 1950's and consist of 5 buildings which span from the 600 block to the 900 block of Pacific Avenue. It is viewed as one of the largest Public Housing Developments in the City. Many seniors live in the Ping Yuen and are often fearful to report crimes such as robberies, burglaries, trespassing, drug dealing and other quality of life issues.

Thanks in partnership to the Chinese Chamber, the Chinatown Community Development Center and the Police Department, all working together on a strategy to address the problems in the Ping Yuen, a Housing Team has been developed.

This team is modeled after Housing Officer Teams in other developments throughout the City. Currently, **Officers Tina To and Mark Milligan** are assigned to the team, with an additional two Officers being added in mid March. (I will profile this team in future editions of the newsletter). Their role is to provide a high visible police presence in the Housing Development. In addition to addressing crime, they will work closely with the residents to build trust and partnerships. The Officers will participate in many community events scheduled in collaboration with the Chinatown Community Development Center. Our plan is to reduce the fear residents have and for everyone to get to know and work with one another on a daily basis.

In the coming weeks, I will report back to you as to how things are going and will include photographs. I have been very public in announcing that to the extent we address crime in the Ping Yuen, we will affect crime in all of Chinatown.

Changes coming in Mid March

Twice a year, Officers are allowed to sign up for shifts based on their seniority. Although I look closely at where Officers are deployed on a daily basis, the semi-annual sign up provides me with an opportunity to look at staffing and deployment throughout the entire station and make significant adjustments if necessary.

I am pleased to announce that we will be expanding our plainclothes team from 1 Sergeant and 4 Officers to 2 Sergeants and 6 Officers. This will allow us to run a full time plainclothes Officer team, who will work to capture those who commit Robberies, Burglaries, Auto Burglaries, Bicycle Thefts, Retail Thefts, Pickpocketing and many other offenses. I look forward to their great work!

In addition, I will be adding two additional Officers to Fisherman's Wharf. This will total 4 fulltime Officers dedicated to address quality of life issues there.

In the coming weeks, I will report back on the results of these changes.

Speaking of our plainclothes team, plainclothes Officers made some great Auto Burglary arrests this past week. We still see this as an issue in our district and the Officers work tirelessly to capture suspects responsible for this crime.

男女拍檔 早11至晚9時 打擊搶劫偷竊

專職巡警執勤 平園增安全感

三藩市華埠公屋平園近日獲派專職警員步行巡邏，兩名日班警員之一的米利根(Mark Milligan)表示，他與華裔女警杜天香已於上周日開始執勤。平園附近民眾說，有警員巡邏執法，感覺比較安全。



記者昨日下午於士德頓街中平園附近「巧遇」獨自一人巡邏的米利根，詢問之下得知，原來他的拍檔杜天香就在附近便衣執法，以打擊搶劫及偷竊等罪案。

步巡對匪徒有震懾作用

米利根透露，華埠近兩日有意外事件發生，其中一宗是罪案，另一宗為一名80多歲的華裔耆英離家迷路，在他們的幫助下聯繫了相關醫療機構，通過醫療記錄幫助尋找家人。
三藩市警方發言人加達丹(Grace Gatpandan)證實，該罪案為人車盜竊，警方周一早9點接報，女事主的汽車後方右車窗被匪徒打破，盜走包括錢包和書籍在內的私人物品，所幸無人受傷。
米利根說，根據他收到的反饋信息，有些匪徒

84歲的教榮阿伯住所在離西平園只有幾步之遙，他說華埠的治安一般，時不時傳出搶劫及盜竊等消息，原因是監獄人滿為患，輕罪者都被釋放，使犯案者增多。他表示附近有步行警員巡邏會有震懾作用，但狡猾的匪徒有時會等到警察走過再動手。

3月增懂華語警員夜巡

治安變差，原因是很多非裔居民搬入平園，而他們所結交者魚龍混雜，讓原先的居民感覺很不安全。Ky對平園有專職警員巡邏的措施表示讚賞，認為有助於維護平園附近的治安。

平園日班警員的工作時間為早上11時至晚上9時，巡邏範圍包括東平園、中平園、西平園和北平園4處公屋及相關街道。
