## Captain Lazar's Message

### New SFPD Headquarters

Today, the San Francisco Police Department celebrated the opening of the new state of the art Headquarters building at 1245 3<sup>rd</sup> Street in Mission Bay. The SFPD Headquarters was housed in the Hall of Justice at 850 Bryant Street since 1961. This is a historic moment for the SFPD and I had the opportunity to attend today's ceremony which was very well attended by many City dignitaries past and present. The building is home to the Department's Administration, the new Southern Station, a new Fire Station and the SFFD/SFPD Arson Task Force. A portion of Investigations still remains at the Hall of Justice.

### District Station Boundaries

The Police Commission voted last night to approve the plan for new boundaries for the 10 District Police Stations. We, in the Central District, will be expanding our boundary to include Powell Street, South to #1 Powell, including the streets that run East from Powell, O'Farrell and Ellis to Grant. In addition, we pick up Market Street, including both sides from 3<sup>rd</sup> Street to the Ferry Building and then south one block to Mission, excluding Mission. We should see this change within 60 to 90 days as the Department of Emergency Management updates the addresses in the Computer Assisted Dispatch system.

### Tonight's Community Meeting

This evening is our monthly community meeting which will be held at the **Hyatt Regency on Drumm Street from 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.** I look forward to presenting an overview of the district and hearing concerns from the community. Retired Sergeant Mark Hernandez will provide a brief presentation about the ALERT Program.

This Sunday I will be putting my bicycle uniform on and participating in a bicycle event sponsored by the Chinatown Community Development Center. CCDC has acquired bicycles for youth and they will be having a workshop followed by a bicycle ride. **Officer David On** and I will be joining them.

**Outstanding Police Work**

I would like to end this week's newsletter highlighting some incredible police work performed by **Officers Scott Korte and Robert Duffield**. These two veteran Officers patrol the lower Nob Hill neighborhood in the daytime. They make great arrests quite frequently of burglars and those in possession of stolen property. They are also good with names of suspects as well as faces.

Yesterday, they were on the 1300 block of Pine Street around 10:00 a.m. when they noticed a male on a bicycle. He had a backpack and was looking all around. Officer Korte remembered that just 2 days prior, he stopped this same suspect for looking into a tradesman entrance with a flashlight.

**Officer Korte and Duffield**, parked their marked police car behind a tree and watched the suspect. They watched him for over 10 minutes looking all around, fumbling with his backpack and repositioning the bicycle he was on. The suspect then stole another bicycle and with the lock still cut around the frame, the Officers detained him. He told the Officers that the second bicycle was his and that he was just picking it up.

As luck would have it, the real owner of the bicycle came walking down the street and reclaimed her stolen bicycle. The suspect was arrested and booked for Grand Theft, Possession of Burglary Tools, Vandalism and Possession of Narcotics Paraphernalia.

## Crimes of Note

### Definitions

**Robbery** – Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

**Assault** – An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

**Battery - (Misdemeanor battery)** is any willful and unlawful touching of another.  
**(Felony battery)** is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

**\*Assault is when a person wings their arm and battery is when that arm makes contact with another person.**

**Aggravated Assault** – Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by any means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

**Burglary** – The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

**Grant Theft** – Grand theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

**Petty Theft** – Theft where the value of the property taken is less than \$950.
