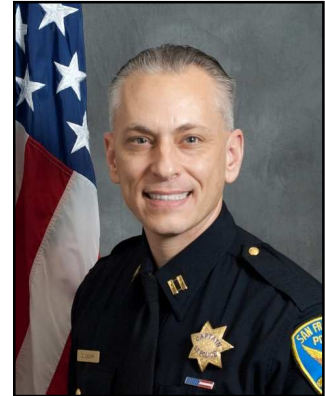

ATM Robbery

Over the last few months, I have mentioned being careful at ATM machines, especially the ones that ask, once the transaction has completed, if you would like another transaction. In these cases, a person may accidentally walk away and the person behind them will attempt to get more money out. On Friday, an incident occurred on the 1400 block of Stockton Street where the suspect stood behind the victim. Instead of waiting for the victim to complete the transaction, the suspect and his accomplice moved in, took over the ATM and took money out. Things to consider:

1. Please be careful when using an ATM, regardless of where and when.
2. Be mindful of individuals who may be around when using the ATM.
3. Make sure you are in a well-lit area and a location you feel safe.
4. Consider limiting the amount of cash you withdraw and carry with you.
5. Consider having others with you when you withdraw money.
6. If you think something is suspicious, it probably is and if you feel unsafe, cancel your transaction and walk away (don't forget your card).

Crimes of Note

Definitions

Robbery – Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

Assault – An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery - (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.
(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

***Assault is when a person wings their arm and battery is when that arm makes contact with another person.**

Aggravated Assault – Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by any means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

Burglary – The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

Grant Theft – Grand theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

Petty Theft – Theft where the value of the property taken is less than \$950.
