### Media Releases

In this week's newsletter, there are two important media releases which were issued yesterday. The first is a great arrest involving three very violent and dangerous men who struck and killed a woman at California and Kearny. These suspects were apprehended yesterday and our Department's Homicide Detail did an outstanding job on this case.

The second involves Ms. Leong, who on Mother's Day, was the victim of an assault and is now in intensive care. We are asking the public to come forward if they know anything about this case.

### Google Voice

I mentioned in my previous newsletter our use of Google Voice. We are putting this together for the Officers assigned to Chinatown and will have a number for them shortly. In the meantime, the Fisherman's Wharf Community Benefit District has established a Google Voice phone number (415-273-9515). By dialing this number, all of the on duty Fisherman's Wharf Foot Beat Officer's phones will ring and so it provides one number for all of their phones. We will start to add these numbers to our last page of this newsletter. Of course, in an emergency, please first dial 911.

**Focus on the Five**

We are ramping up our traffic enforcement in the Central District. Our goal is to focus on the top 5 primary factors which cause collisions. The violations are speeding, running red signal lights, failing to yield to pedestrians in the crosswalk, unsafe turning and unsafe lane changes. Yesterday, Officer Troy Courtney served as a decoy in plainclothes at Sansome and Green Streets. 29 citations were issued for failing to yield to a pedestrian in the crosswalk!

**Fisherman's Wharf Community Benefit District's Security Summit**

Congratulations to Troy Campbell and the Fisherman's Wharf CBD for hosting the first security summit this morning at Pier 39. Assistant District Attorney Karen Catalona, Rann Parker from the Homeless Outreach Team, The CEO of Social Media Townsquared, and I were all presenters. These meetings serve as an excellent way for the Fisherman's Wharf community to stay connected and communicate about crime.

**Crime Issues and Great Arrests!**

I am starting to see reports again on packages being stolen upon delivery from package carriers. I have only seen two reports so far but that usually means I will see more. The incident I am referencing occurred on the 800 block of Sutter Street last week. Please keep this in mind when ordering on line or when expecting a delivery. Take the necessary precautions to avoid your package from being stolen such as coordinating with a neighbor or having the package delivered to a secure location.

On Sunday 5/17/15, **Officers Dickson and Foxworth** were on patrol near Geary and Stockton when a person on the street told them a suspect robbed them of their cell phone. Both Officers chased the suspect and captured the juvenile! Great police work!

On Saturday 5/16/15, **Sergeants Wong and Gaines, Officers McEachern, Chan, Pena and Fogarty** responded to a burglary in progress at around 4:30 a.m. on the 400 block of Pacific where they took the suspect into custody. Great work!

## Crimes of Note

### Definitions

**Robbery** – Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

**Assault** – An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

**Battery - (Misdemeanor battery)** is any willful and unlawful touching of another.  
**(Felony battery)** is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

**\*Assault is when a person swings their arm and battery is when that arm makes contact with another person.**

**Aggravated Assault** – Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by any means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

**Burglary** – The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

**Grant Theft** – Grand theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

**Petty Theft** – Theft where the value of the property taken is less than \$950.

**San Francisco Police Investigators Seek Assistance in Assault of Elderly Woman**

Investigators from the SFPD Major Crimes Unit are asking for the public to assist them in the investigation of an assault that occurred on May 10, 2015. The victim, a 77 year old Asian female, was exiting a MUNI bus when she was assaulted by the suspect, who reportedly struck the victim at least twice on the head. The suspect was described as a black female.

Investigators believe that at least one Good Samaritan came upon the scene and assisted the victim by moving her away from the side of the MUNI bus and into a seated position on the sidewalk. The Good Samaritan is believed to be a white male. Investigators would like to speak with him or anyone who may have witnessed this crime.

The incident is believed to have occurred between 12:00 P.M. and 2:30 P.M. on May 10<sup>th</sup> in the area Chinatown area, possibly on Stockton Street. The victim is a frequent rider of the following MUNI lines: 2 Clement, 3 Jackson, 30 Stockton and the 45 Union / Stockton, often traveling between the Japan town and the China town neighborhoods. She is currently hospitalized with life threatening injuries.

**San Francisco Police Make Arrest in Hit and Run Homicide**

In the early morning hours on May 20, 2015, the San Francisco Police Department Homicide Detail served several search warrants throughout the cities of San Francisco, Hayward, and Santa Rosa. Three suspects were responsible for several crimes including robberies, evading police, and the murder of Bridget Klecker on April 10, 2015 at California and Kearny Streets in San Francisco. The suspects were taken into custody without incident.

This was a collaborative law enforcement effort and the SFPD would like to thank the Federal Bureau of Investigations SWAT team, Santa Rosa Police Department, Santa Rosa College Campus Police, Santa Rosa County District Attorney Investigators, Hayward Police Department, and the Daly City Police Department for all their assistance which led to the apprehension of these dangerous felons.

The following suspects were booked at San Francisco County Jail on homicide, conspiracy, evasion of police, possession of a stolen vehicle, and multiple robbery charges (booking photos are attached):
