### Traffic Safety

This month, we suffered the loss of Ms. Zhou, a resident of Chinatown. She was crossing the street at Clay and Kearny when she was struck by a vehicle making a left turn. As I have written in prior newsletters, as motorists, we have to slow down and be aware of the pedestrians and bicyclists who share the roadway with us.

Clay and Kearny is a very challenging intersection. Today from 3:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., I will be in plainclothes crossing the street. For those motorists who do not yield, they will receive a citation by a waiting police officer. Our plan is to use this process to educate motorists about the importance of yielding to pedestrians in a crosswalk and as a result, save lives!

### Auto Burglaries

Once in a while, I am asked why the Central district has numerous reported auto burglaries. Between Tuesday and Wednesday, there were 26 reported incidents on my desk. The answer is that the payoff is often big and auto burglary suspects know that they would rather be caught committing a property crime than a violent crime such as a street robbery. This point was reinforced to me when I read a report of a recent auto burglary. The victim, a 29 year old female and her boyfriend, a 37 year old male from Denver, Colorado parked their vehicle on the 500 block of Vallejo Street at 10:00 p.m. last Monday. They returned to their car 40 minutes later and discovered their window was smashed and their property was stolen from the trunk. One of the items taken was a bag which contained \$12,000 in cash. This makes a good case for not leaving items in the trunk and this type of loss reminds the criminals that the tourist areas of San Francisco are places to commit this crime.

### Auto Thefts

Lately, I have seen a rise in Auto Thefts. If you park your vehicle on the street, you may want to consider taking extra measures to ensure your vehicle is not stolen. There are anti-theft devices out there that may be able to deter a thief. Popular vehicles, although not limited to these types of vehicles, are 1990's model Hondas.

## Crimes of Note

### Definitions

**Robbery** – Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

**Assault** – An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

**Battery - (Misdemeanor battery)** is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

**(Felony battery)** is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

**\*Assault is when a person swings their arm and battery is when that arm makes contact with another person.**

**Aggravated Assault** – Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by any means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

**Burglary** – The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

**Grant Theft** – Grand theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

**Petty Theft** – Theft where the value of the property taken is less than \$950.
