## Captain Lazar's Message

### Violent Robbery Suspects Apprehended in Russian Hill!!!

Congratulations to our plainclothes team at Central Station! This team is supervised by **Lieutenant Matthews** and have been working daily to combat the auto burglaries on Russian Hill. This has been accomplished by deploying a police car in the area all throughout the day, 7 days a week. In addition, the plainclothes team is consistently in the neighborhood making arrests.

On Saturday, June 24, 2016, the plainclothes team, led by **Sergeant Spagnuolo** and his team consisting of **Officers Huang, Christensen, Reyes and Johnson** watched three suspects as they backed into a parking space on Filbert and Jones. Officers observed the suspects, one of them in possession of a firearm, rob three tourists. The Officers moved in quickly and placed all three suspects into custody!

Attached is the YouTube video of this arrest now nearly at 1 million views. I spoke with most of the officers this afternoon and not only thanked them for their outstanding work, but also said that my appreciation extends to the dozens of times they have made these same arrests, not captured on video.

We have much more work to do on Russian Hill and in other areas to address crime. Our partnership with the community will make the difference.

I am grateful for the numerous emails and phone calls I have received thanking the officers for their bravery and heroics in this case, including from Tina Moylan from the Russian Hill Neighbors and Supervisor Peskin. All of the officers signed up to capture criminals and make our community safer. This is an example of the work they do every day.

## Crimes of Note

### Definitions

**Robbery** – Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

**Assault** – An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

**Battery - (Misdemeanor battery)** is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

**(Felony battery)** is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

**\*Assault is when a person swings their arm and battery is when that arm makes contact with another person.**

**Aggravated Assault** – Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by any means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

**Burglary** – The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

**Grand Theft** – Grand theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

**Petty Theft** – Theft where the value of the property taken is less than \$950.

### **San Francisco Police Make Arrest in Russian Hill Armed Robbery**

On Saturday, June 25, 2016 officers from Central Station's Plain Clothes Team were working a vehicle theft abatement assignment. At approximately 1:10 PM, the suspects parked their Chrysler on the 1000 block of Filbert Street. One of the suspects remained with the vehicle while the other two set out on foot towards the "crooked" portion of Lombard Street. A plain clothes officer was on foot and observed them.

Now out of the car, one suspect approached the three female victims who had been visiting the "crooked street." This suspect produced a gun and demanded their property. One victim fled on foot screaming for help. The two remaining victims fought to maintain possession of a backpack and camera. Seeing this, the plain clothes officer radioed in a robbery in progress and requested back up. Meanwhile, the second suspect stepped in to help the first suspect. Together, they overpowered the victims taking the backpack and camera.

The suspects ran to the parked Chrysler where they were taken into custody. Police officers recovered both the backpack and camera as well as a loaded handgun that had been reported stolen in Louisiana. The victims were shaken up but sustained only minor injuries. The suspects were later booked at San Francisco County Jail. Booking photos accompany this press release.


