Yesterday, Central Station, in partnership with the Chinese Chamber of Commerce and San Francisco SAFE hosted a Public Safety Meeting in Chinatown. The meeting was held at the Gordon J. Lau Elementary School at 950 Clay Street and was well attended. This was a great opportunity to talk about reporting crime, language access, and personal safety. Chinatown Footbeat **Officers Howard Chu, Sam Yuen and David On** were there and were able to interact with the residents and merchants. We also were able to hear concerns from the Community. It was a successful meeting and I believe it is essential we keep open communication and form partnerships. Thank you to all who attended!

"Focus on the Five"

I mentioned to you that we will continue to focus on traffic enforcement in the Central District. As part of our "Focus on the Five" program, **Sergeant Hurwitz** led a team of Officers on an afternoon operation to enforce speeding in the Broadway Tunnel. The operation resulted in 34 citations issued!

I also want to thank the members of the Traffic Company who have been conducting enforcement along the Embarcadero in the early morning for speeding. In this past week, they have written 75 citations since Monday! Incredible job in keeping our streets safe!

Great Arrests this Week!

There are three great arrests I would like to feature this week:

In mid June, a woman who works on the 200 block of Grant was confronted by a male who attempted to take her person. The woman was able to take a cell phone photo of the suspect. The suspect threatened the woman saying that he knew where she worked.

Two weeks later, **Officer John Ferrando** arrested an individual for a Narcotics offense. Officer Ferrando remembered seeing a photo of the suspect in a report from two weeks prior and by conducting a thorough investigation, was able to match his suspect with the suspect from the case on Grant Street! Outstanding work!

On July 1st, Central Station Plainclothes Team Inspector Paulsen, Officers Garcia-Morales, Richins, Huang, Murphy and Christensen were on patrol when they began to watch two individuals, one of them broke into a vehicle and stole two backpacks at Chestnut and Leavenworth. Both suspects were captured! Excellent police work!

The Plainclothes team, **Inspector Paulsen, Officers Garcia-Morales, Richins, Huang**, **Murphy and Christensen** made a great arrest yesterday. At around 7:00 p.m, the team saw what they believed were suspects casing businesses on the 400 block of Jackson Street. The suspects were able to get into a door and steal a laptop, wallet and cash. Soon thereafter, they were apprehended!

Fireworks Safety



Every Fourth of July, more fires are reported nationwide than on any other day of the year, with 50% of those fires being fireworks-related. Homes, wooded & grassy areas, and even automobiles have become engulfed in flames because of fireworks. On the Fourth of July over the past three years, the San Francisco Fire Department has responded to 53 fireworks-related grass fires, in addition to multiple structure fires that were also caused by fireworks. Most commonly the fires are caused by bottle rocket-type fireworks, where the rockets can land in dry vegetation, on rooftops, or wedge within structures, and still retain enough heat to cause a fire.

In recent years, fireworks have been one of the leading causes of serious injuries that require emergency treatment in a hospital ER. Fireworks can cause severe burns, fractures or scars, and can even result in death or life-long disfigurement. The thousands of serious injuries that occur each year typically involve damage to the eyes, head or hands, with the risk of fireworks-related injuries highest for children 5 - 14. Even though novelty fireworks, such as fountains and sparklers, are generally considered to be "safe", they can reach temperatures of more than 1,000° F, and account for 36% of all emergency room fireworks-related injuries.

There ARE safer alternatives to using fireworks on the Fourth of July. Public fireworks displays can be the safest and smartest, and even most economical, fireworks alternative. The San Francisco Bay Area hosts several free public fireworks displays every Fourth of July. Text a Tip from your cellular phone - It's still anonymous

Through computers with Internet capability, SFPD Operations personnel will view all tips received 24/7 and evaluate each one. If the tip is of an emergency nature, personnel will forward it immediately to the Department of Emergency Management for officer dispatch. They will forward all other tips for assignment to the appropriate investigative bureau or district station. Investigative units will have an Internet-capable computer at their disposal and will be able to text back and forth with the tipster

based on a randomly assigned ID number that the system provided by Citizen Observer, Inc., supplies. The ID number is wholly confidential and is maintained in the company's server.

Procedure: Enter either TIP411 or 847411 in the "To" field and the keyword SFPD in the text field, followed by the message.

311 Customer Service Center:

What is 311? 311 is a toll free, NON-EMERGENCY phone number that the public can call to access information about government services. A live customer service representative will be available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and 365 days a year. The service is available to both wired and wireless customers. Wireless customers should call (415) 701-2311. 311 employees will be able to provide translations services in more than 145 languages and dialects and will employ a diverse staff of customer service representatives. Once your complaint is logged you will be given a tracking number to follow up on at a later date. Additionally, 311 are set up to accept calls from the hearing impaired by utilizing a TTY System. Text-a-Tip Set Up Instructions

Non-Blackberry Cellular Telephones: Dial 847411-thenSAVE this to your phone contacts as a mobile number. Name this new contact TIP411. Now the number is ready to be used to send text messages. When sending a message, type SFPD then leave a space. Type your Message and Send. You will receive a reply message in seconds.

Blackberry telephones: Similar to above. First you need to add TIP411 to your mobile contact list. Select TIP411 enter. The cursor will be in blue on the #8 (847411). Click the ball and select SMS TEXT TIP411. Type your message starting with SFPD (space) ... then send. You will receive a response within seconds.
