### Auto Burglaries

Last week I received an email from a family in Florida who had their car burglarized at Polk and Beach. This is a common theme this summer. Thanks to the work of my Community Police Advisory Board, specifically Troy Campbell, Karin Flood and Jennifer Roche, we are working to get our message out about "Park Smart." You will now see new signage at Pier 39 and this morning, we met with Ghirardelli Square. There are other ideas in the works to message auto burglary prevention that I will share with you in the weeks to come.

I would like to conclude this week's newsletter by acknowledging some great police work.

The plainclothes team, **Officers Huang, Reyes and Christensen** captured two auto burglars at Northpoint and Taylor on July 14<sup>th</sup>.

This same team captured a bicycle thief from 5 Embarcadero on July 14<sup>th</sup> as well.

**Officers Jim Horan and Minh Du** arrested a cell phone thief on the 400 block of Montgomery on July 15<sup>th</sup>.

**Officer Robert Glenn** arrested three suspects at Hyde and Filbert on July 16<sup>th</sup>. The suspects had a firearm, marijuana and gloves.

Plainclothes **Officers Tiumalu, Johnson and Macaulay** in partnership with **Officers Jessica Zamora and Francesca Murphy** captured a juvenile who stole a cell phone from another person at July 18<sup>th</sup> at Jackson and Davis.

Last, thanks to a couple of merchants in Chinatown, on the 1100 block of Stockton Street on July 18<sup>th</sup>, one robbery suspect was captured. **Officer Minh Du** captured the second suspect and the plainclothes team led by **Sergeant Rich Jones** captured the third suspect the following day who is responsible for several "chain snatch" robberies in Chinatown.

## Crimes of Note

### Definitions

**Robbery** – Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

**Assault** – An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

**Battery - (Misdemeanor battery)** is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

**(Felony battery)** is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

**\*Assault is when a person swings their arm and battery is when that arm makes contact with another person.**

**Aggravated Assault** – Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by any means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

**Burglary** – The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

**Grand Theft** – Grand theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

**Petty Theft** – Theft where the value of the property taken is less than \$950.



# Featured Officer of the Month

## Officer Pavel Khmarskiy

*Each month Central Police Station features one of its officers in an effort to learn more about the men and women who police our neighborhood. This month, we interviewed Officer Pavel Khmarskiy, a 2-year member of Central Police Station.*

### **SFPD Makes Arrests in Chain Robbery Series**

Since early June 2016, there have been five robberies in the Central district involving suspects using a Sports Utility Vehicle (SUV). The suspects would approach males and females with gold necklaces in Chinatown. The suspects would violently rip the chains off the victims' necks, then flee to the waiting SUV.

On Monday, July 18, 2016 at approximately 11:36 PM a Chinatown foot beat officer saw the suspected robbery getaway vehicle parked on the 700 block of Jackson Street. A short time later, units were advised that a robbery had just occurred at 1100 block of Stockton Street and bystanders were holding a suspect.

The bystanders told the officer that the suspect pulled the necklace off a female victim and advised that another suspect fled the scene prior to the arrival of the officers. While the officers conducted their investigation an additional suspect was located in the area and taken into custody.

Further investigation of the robberies led to the arrest of a third suspect.

Marc Dorsey, 19 years old, Byron Birchett, 18 years old and Razzaaq Manney, 20 years old, all Oakland residents, were booked at the San Francisco County Jail for a total of four different robberies and other various charges.

Booking photos are not available due to I.D. pending matters.


