Sexual Battery Series in Nob Hill and Russian Hill

We have had a crime series occurring in Nob Hill and Russian Hill. The recent incidents were first reported on July 15, 2015 through July 26, 2015. It was quiet for a few days however a new incident surfaced early yesterday morning at Union and Leavenworth. We are working closely with the community and the Department's Special Victims Unit is actively investigating these cases.

Late this evening, I am organizing a Community Walk in Nob Hill and Russian Hill. This is in partnership with Tina Moylan who represents the Russian Hill Neighbors and is on the Board for SF Safe. Joining us will be Mason Lee from the Supervisor's Office. The goal is to walk the neighborhood from 10:00 p.m. to 12:00 a.m., providing public safety information to women who are walking alone in the neighborhood. Volunteers will be teamed up with an Officer and may volunteer anywhere from half an hour to the full two hours.

If you are interested in participating, please meet me at the intersection of Hyde and Filbert at 10:00 p.m. this evening.

Below is the press release regarding these incidents:

Investigators from the San Francisco Police Department Special Victims Unit are seeking assistance from the public in an ongoing investigation into sexual batteries that occurred in the Russian and Nob Hill neighborhoods.

Victims have filed police reports regarding incidents of groping that occurred between the hours of 10:00 PM and 1:00 AM in both the Russian Hill and Nob Hill neighborhoods. The earliest report was filed in February of 2015 and several other incidents have been reported in the subsequent months. Officers from Central and Northern Police Stations as well as the Patrol Bureau Task Force have been working jointly to increase plain clothes patrols in an effort to apprehend the suspect(s). Uniformed police patrols have also been stepped up in these neighborhoods.

The victims have described the suspect as a male adult, in his late 20s to late 30's, between 5'-06" and 5'-10" tall, with a build ranging from thin, to athletic to heavy set.

Auto Burglary Arrest

Central Station's Plainclothes Team has done a great job this week capturing Auto Burglary suspects, arresting approximately 80 suspects year to date. On August 4, 2015, I mentioned to the team that I would like to see them at the National Night Out event. **Sergeant McDevitt** replied that first they would like to capture an auto burglar suspect and they did. At 1:00 p.m., they were around Ghirardelli Square, traveling at Larkin and Beach when **Officer Richins and Inspector Paulsen** observed 2 men looking into windows of parked cars. The team, **Officers Christensen and Murphy**, along with **Sergeant McDevitt** joined in the surveillance. At Polk and Bay, they observed one suspect break a car window, reach in and pass a backpack to the second suspect. The first suspect was captured right away and the second suspect took off running. After a foot pursuit, the second suspect was taken into custody. One suspect resides in Stockton, Ca, and the other, a juvenile, is from San Francisco.

The victim, a tourist, residing in Salt Lake City, Utah, was glad we recovered his camera, camera lens, laptop and backpack, totaling \$4,300 worth of property. Excellent police work by one of the best plainclothes team in the City!

Crimes of Note

Definitions

Robbery – Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

Assault – An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery - (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

***Assault is when a person swings their arm and battery is when that arm makes contact with another person.**

Aggravated Assault – Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by any means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

Burglary – The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

Grant Theft – Grand theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

Petty Theft – Theft where the value of the property taken is less than \$950.



The CENTRAL DISTRICT commences at a point on the water north of where Mission St. intersects with The Embarcadero and proceeding west on Mission St. (excluding both sides) to 3rd St.; north on 3rd St. (including both sides) to Market St.; west on Market St. (excluding both sides) to Powell St.; north on Powell St. (including both sides) to Geary St.; west on Geary St. (including both sides) to Larkin St.; north on Larkin St. (including both sides) to Bay St.; west on Bay St. (including both sides) to Van Ness Ave.; north on Van Ness Ave. (including both sides), and continuing north on the Municipal Pier Access Road (including both sides) to a point on the water just west of the Municipal Pier; east and south from a point on the water just west of the Municipal Pier, following the shoreline, to the origin at a point on the water north of where Mission St. intersects with The Embarcadero.
