Monthly Community Meeting

Each month, I will present on what we did to address the prior month's concerns. This evening, we will have a presentation by "Community Boards." I hope to see you there!

Community Support

I am very grateful for those of you I meet in the neighborhoods from time to time who approach me and speak about how much you support the police and are grateful for the Officers assigned to Central Station. Amongst ourselves, we at Central Station talk about how fortunate we are to work in this district and how grateful we are to have such support. So, the feeling is mutual and I want everyone to know that the majority of the Officers have waited many years on a wait list to work at Central Station and there is no assignment they would rather have, including me!

Sergeant Promotions!

The Department just announced promotions to the rank of Sergeant. As you know, Sergeants hold one of the most important positions in the organization. These members are the first line supervisors who have direct oversight of the work performed by Officers in the field. They are looked at as mentors and roll models and Officers rely on them for their guidance and expertise. We all remember when we were new Officers and had that Sergeant we looked up to and wanted to be like. Sergeants also serve as Investigators, investigating crimes. Inspectors also serve in this role. Central Station has six Sergeants and two Inspectors who investigate Robberies, Burglaries, Auto Thefts, and Assaults.

I congratulate **Officers Ray Callo, John Ferrando, George Perez, Leonard Caldera, Jacqueline Selinger, Willie Pon and Sergio Lopez** who received word of their promotion yesterday and informed that their last day at Central Station will be tomorrow. We will miss their great work and I thank them for serving the residents, merchants and visitors of the Central District

Property Crime

Property Crime in the Central is up 16% year to date. This includes Burglaries, Auto Burglaries and Auto Theft. We have plans to address the crime in all of these categories. I have mentioned Auto Burglaries in prior newsletters. A good way to prevent this crime is to not leave anything in your vehicle and to tell others. Soon, I will be reaching out to the hotels and rental car companies to ask for their assistance in reminding tourists. Central Station's Community Police Advisory Board is working on the design for an informational flyer.

I read every report, including the Auto Theft reports. I frequently notice Hondas, Toyotas and Nissans as vehicles frequently stolen. Especially 1990's models. I suggest that if you own this type of vehicle, please consider the various options of anti theft devices to make it that much more difficult for the auto thief to steal the vehicle.

Outstanding Arrests Made

Central Station Officers do incredible work every day. This work is not usually in the media and the average citizen is unaware of the great work taking place. I was very proud of the work performed by Officers within about a 12 hour span from August 19th through August 20th. First, at around 11:00 a.m., **Officers Willie Pon and Lauren Candeo**, by way of their investigative skills, placed a woman under arrest for possessing a stolen vehicle and stolen items on the 200 block of Pacific. This was followed at about 2:30 p.m., by our plainclothes team led by **Sergeant McDevitt, with Officers Richins, Huang, Morales, Christensen and Ciudad** who followed two suspects in the Fisherman's Wharf area and observed them steal mail from residences on Bay Street and North Point. The two were taken into custody. Then, a burglary occurred at a business on Fisherman's Wharf a few days prior where a security camera captured the image. Sergeant Toomey (Southern Station), and Central Station Officer Korte and Cummins identified the suspect and at approximately 7:30 p.m., he was charged with the burglary. Last, at around midnight, a suspect broke into a business on the 700 block of Geary Street. **Lieutenant Hoo and Officers Navarro, Wong, Horan, Pardini, and O'Neil** quickly responded to the location and captured the suspect! All incredible work!

Vision Zero

We are focusing on traffic enforcement in the Central District. Public Schools started this week and I am grateful for the Motorcycle Officers from the Traffic Company who have conducted enforcement around our district schools. This enforcement is a priority for us as we keep the community safe.

Speaking of traffic enforcement, on August 8th and August 10th, Central Station Officers conducted traffic enforcement in the Broadway Tunnel. The speed limit is 35mph. 9 citations were issued. The majority of the motorists were traveling at over 50 mph. I thank **Officers Willie Pon and Sam Yuen** for their work in the Broadway Tunnel!

The San Francisco Police Department has developed a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is modeled after and works in partnership with the San Francisco Fire Department's Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT). The ALERT program will train members of the public to assist law enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster. Such tasks may include: traffic control, foot patrol of business and residential areas, and reporting criminal activity. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and live, work, or attend high school in San Francisco.

Three steps to becoming an ALERT volunteer:

1. Complete NERT training and receive certification. To register for NERT training courses please visit www.sfgov.org/sfnert
2. Once NERT certified, forward a copy of your NERT ID card to the ALERT program. sfpdalert@sfgov.org
3. After clearing a basic background check the individual is eligible to register for ALERT training.
