## Captain Lazar's Message

### Russian Hill Robbery

As you may have read or viewed in the media, we had a robbery that occurred on Tuesday, August 25, 2015 at 12:09 p.m at Lombard and Jones. A tourist from Thailand was with two of his friends when he was robbed of his camera. The tourists fought back and one of the two suspects involved shot the victim.

Central Station Officers quickly responded to the scene and rendered aid to the victim. **Officer Anthony Randolph**, knowing that there were sufficient resources at the scene, decided to look for the suspect vehicle. Based on his experience, he set up surveillance at the intersection of 1<sup>st</sup> Street and Harrison. Within moments, he observed the vehicle and gave chase. The pursuit ended on the Oakland/Emeryville border where our partner agencies (CHP, Oakland, Emeryville and Berkeley Police), along with Officers from Northern, Tenderloin and the Tactical Company assisted us in taking both suspects into custody. I am grateful for the incredible police work and we will continue our work in maintaining safety on Russian Hill.

### Traffic Enforcement

This month, including this morning, we conducted three separate traffic enforcement operations at Sansome and Green. We know that vehicles traveling along Sansome, quite often, do not stop for pedestrians who are attempting to cross the street. In the three operations, we issued a total of 80 citations to motorists.

I received the below email from the Department's Community Relations Unit on one of our many outstanding Officers, **Officer Robert Duffield**:

To whom it may concern,

I wanted to **compliment and commend** Officer Robert Duffield (Star No. #510) from Central Station for his professionalism and service to our city residents.

On August 15th 2015, I was assaulted by a local with severe drug abuser and mental health issues who has been regularly harassed my family and neighbors. When Officer Duffield came to take my police report, I was still upset from the attack and he was extremely patient. Officer Duffield kindly offered advice about what I should do in the future when he returned and how I should coordinate with my neighbors to make sure we were not living in fear of future attacks.

On the morning of August 16th, I heard aggressive yelling outside and saw that the same individual who had assaulted me the day before had returned and was in a very agitated and aggressive mental state. One of my neighbors had already called 911 and I saw that Officer Duffield was already outside my building and had called paramedics in order to assist him.

From my vantage point it appeared as if this individual lunged at or attacked Officer Duffield. Rather than trying to violently defend himself, Officer Duffield restrained the individual with absolute minimal force. After more than 10 minutes, Officer Duffield was able to temporarily calm the individual so that the paramedics could triage and treat the individual and transport him to a hospital. I doubt many people would have the patience to handle this type of situation in such a professional manner.

In a day in age when people only talk about a handful of evil deeds from a visible minority, its important to give identify, commend and thank the unseen majority of civil servants who continue to do the 'right' thing when no one is looking. There are many unsung heroes, so I hope this letter will uncover one kind deed for the hundreds that go unappreciated every day.

## Crimes of Note

### Definitions

**Robbery** – Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

**Assault** – An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

**Battery - (Misdemeanor battery)** is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

**(Felony battery)** is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

**\*Assault is when a person swings their arm and battery is when that arm makes contact with another person.**

**Aggravated Assault** – Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by any means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

**Burglary** – The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

**Grant Theft** – Grand theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

**Petty Theft** – Theft where the value of the property taken is less than \$950.


