The Chinese Chamber provided a significant donation which enabled us to feed over 700 people who attended. I am grateful for Mayor Lee and Supervisor Christensen along with other City officials attending. Last, thank you to the San Francisco Police Academy who sent 47 Academy Recruits to participate. A Few Great Arrests!

There were a few great arrests I would like to share with you:

On August 27, 2015, **Inspector Paulsen, Officers Richins, Murphy and Christensen** were in the area of Bay and Kearny. This is a common area for Auto Burglaries. They saw a person riding a bicycle on the sidewalk while carrying two bags. While watching this person, the above plainclothes team located a car which was burglarized. They had reasonable suspicion to detain the bicyclist based on a set of facts. Officers linked the bicyclist to the Auto Burglary. In one of the bags taken in the Auto Burglary was \$4,000 in cash. The victim from Boston was thankful to get her cash back. Incredible police work!

On August 28, 2015, early in the morning, **Officer Worrell** and his recruit, newly Academy graduate **Officer Carr**, were on patrol on the 1300 block of Clay when they heard a woman screaming. The Officers noticed a male holding a woman against her will in an open garage to a residence. The Officers ordered the suspect to stop but he took off running. The Officers were able to capture him. Their investigation revealed that when the victim opened her garage door, the suspect entered and robbed her. Great arrest!

On August 31, 2015, in the middle of the night, **Officers Gunter and Horan** responded to a report of two suspects on the roof of a building on the 700 block of Sutter Street. They were assisted by **Officers Olcomendy, Chan and Nguyen**. They were able to capture two suspects, after a foot pursuit, who were responsible for graffiti/vandalism in the area. In the suspects' possession were spray canisters and paint markers. Graffiti is an issue for us in the Central District. Thanks to these Officers, two suspects were taken off of the streets as well!

On September 1, 2015 in the morning, **Officers Duffield and Korte**, two veteran Officers who patrol the lower Nob Hill area and are known for capturing criminals, were at Geary and Larkin when they observed a couple of drug sellers. Their investigation led to the arrest of one of the individuals. Seized as evidence, forty six individually wrapped rocks of cocaine. Great arrest taking drug dealers off of our streets!

Watch Out For These Crimes!

I would like to conclude this week's message with a recap on a couple of crimes to watch out for:

On August 29, 2015, a woman was at Post and Kearny in the evening when a person grabbed a cell phone out of her hand and took off running.

On August 24, 2015 at 2:00 p.m., the victim was depositing a check at an ATM. The suspect was looking over the victim's shoulder watching the PIN being entered. Just before the transaction was over, the suspect stood in front of the victim and was able to withdraw \$800 from the account.

On August 28, 2015, on Montgomery Street, a similar incident occurred where a male shoved a woman to the side while she was using the ATM. He took over and withdrew money.

Last is an elderly scam which is common:

An elderly woman received a call from a subject claiming to be her grandson. The suspect said he was in Bismark North Dakota and needed \$5,000 to bail out from jail. He handed the phone to a person claiming to be with a law enforcement agency. The elderly woman believed this to be true. The suspect told the woman to call a certain 800 phone number. She did and provided information on the transferring of the funds. She later found out that her grandson was not in North Dakota.


It should be noted that a similar incident occurred with another victim in the last few weeks. This person was out \$15,000 as a result of a similar scam.

Crimes of Note

Definitions

Robbery – Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

Assault – An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery - (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

***Assault is when a person swings their arm and battery is when that arm makes contact with another person.**

Aggravated Assault – Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by any means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

Burglary – The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

Grant Theft – Grand theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

Petty Theft – Theft where the value of the property taken is less than \$950.



The CENTRAL DISTRICT commences at a point on the water north of where Mission St. intersects with The Embarcadero and proceeding west on Mission St. (excluding both sides) to 3rd St.; north on 3rd St. (including both sides) to Market St.; west on Market St. (excluding both sides) to Powell St.; north on Powell St. (including both sides) to Geary St.; west on Geary St. (including both sides) to Larkin St.; north on Larkin St. (including both sides) to Bay St.; west on Bay St. (including both sides) to Van Ness Ave.; north on Van Ness Ave. (including both sides), and continuing north on the Municipal Pier Access Road (including both sides) to a point on the water just west of the Municipal Pier; east and south from a point on the water just west of the Municipal Pier, following the shoreline, to the origin at a point on the water north of where Mission St. intersects with The Embarcadero.
