I would like to take a moment to recap some great police work in the last few days:

On November 28, 2015, **Officers Justin Leach and Pierre Battle** captured a suspect for burglarizing a construction site on the 600 block of Market Street.

On November 29, 2015, **Sergeant Vanderbilt, Officers Derek Christensen, Michael Reyes, and Ed Huang** watched a suspect at Hyde and Lombard who was standing in a nearby doorway. He was dressed in black and appeared to be attempting to gain entry into the residence. They watched the suspect then go to another residence. They followed him as he tried doors and attempted to gain access to various residences. The officers detained the suspect at Union and Polk. In his possession were garage door openers, a broken keybox, a drill, handsaw and cable cutter. These officers prevented a burglary that evening.

On November 29, 2015, **Officers Ryan Jones and Kurt Macaulay** responded to a person with a gun call at Fisherman's Wharf on the 100 block of Jefferson Street. There, they encountered the suspect and took him into custody. The suspect was armed with a .45 caliber handgun.

On November 30, 2014, **Officers John Murphy and Al Ciudad** captured a robbery suspect who put scissors to the victim's neck and stole her iPhone at Pacific and Powell Streets.

### **Graffiti Vandal**

A suspect, responsible for graffiti on the 800 block of Geary Street back in August, was convicted for his crime last month. The case was made by video cameras.

## Crimes of Note

### Definitions

**Robbery** – Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

**Assault** – An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

**Battery - (Misdemeanor battery)** is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

**(Felony battery)** is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

\***Assault** is when a person swings their arm and **battery** is when that arm makes contact with another person.

**Aggravated Assault** – Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by any means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

**Burglary** – The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

**Grand Theft** – Grand theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

**Petty Theft** – Theft where the value of the property taken is less than \$950.

### San Francisco Police Investigation Leads to the Arrest of A Child Pornography Suspect

As the result of an online investigation conducted by the San Francisco Police Department Internet Crimes Against Children Unit (ICAC), a search warrant was secured for an address on the 1400 block of Hyde Street, in the City and County of San Francisco. On November 24, 2105 at 5:00PM SFPD investigators and officers served the search warrant.

During the search warrant service, investigators located several media devices which contained hundreds of child pornography videos and images depicting juvenile minors engaged in sexual acts.

During the investigation it was determined that the devices belonged to a resident of the apartment, Zachary Singh, age 29, who was not present during the service of the search warrant. Investigators determined that Singh was in Southern California for the holidays.

ICAC investigators obtained an arrest warrant for Singh and he was located at a residence in Santa Barbara. On November 25<sup>th</sup>, Singh was taken into custody by detectives from the Santa Barbara Sheriff's Department.

Zachary Singh was booked into the Santa Barbara County Jail for possession of child pornography, Distribution of child pornography (2 counts), and possession of over 600 files of child pornography. Singh bailed out of custody and has a pending court date in San Francisco. A booking photo accompanies this press release.

**Safe Shopper 2015 - Holiday Season Safety Tips**

"The Mayor and SFPD want everyone to have a safe holiday shopping season. We also want all gifts to reach those they are intended for. With that in mind, here are some tips that will help accomplish both. Happy Holidays," said Chief Suhr.

During this holiday season, the Police Department will be working to enhance safety for residents, visitors, and shoppers. There will be increased foot patrols to shopping areas throughout the city, including the horse/mounted unit, plain clothes officers, and traffic enforcement.

- Remain alert when using electronic devices.
- Help avoid vehicle break-ins, leave nothing visible in your car
- Move your vehicle to a different location each time you load packages in the trunk.
- Try to park in a lot where there is an attendant.
- Always be alert to your surroundings.
- Have your keys in your hand as you approach your vehicle.
- Do not overburden yourself with packages and other items.
- Keep packages locked in your trunk while shopping.
- Shop with a companion, especially after dark, whenever possible.
- Keep wallets in hard-to-reach places, your front pocket for example.
- Be wary of anyone causing a distraction in close-quartered places, such as on public transit.
- Carry only the cash and credit cards that you will need.
- Keep cash separate from ID and credit cards.
- Do not carry your passport or social security card.
- If someone demands your purse or wallet, surrender it as resisting may result in bodily harm.


