### **Activism**

#### Mechanical Street Cleaning

Meetings with DPW to add street cleaning without the requirement of petitions.

#### Doggie Do

- Because of too much dog poo on the streets and in planters, we surveyed our community. Dog owners said..."We Need More Trash Cans!"
- We carry orange chalk everywhere and circle doggie do left behind with the word NO!.
- We've created a sign What's Up Dog? transparency for city-wide use if requested.

#### Trash Cans

• We mapped locations of all trash cans. Requested trash receptables in specific locations with a goal to have a can within 3 blocks of all residents or visitor. 7 of the 15 were approved and installed!

#### Cigarette Litter

• We have teamed-upped with Refuse Refuse and NSAC to research ways to eliminate toxic cigarette waste.
We have reached out to public officials from our Supervisor Peskin to Senator Weiner to Assemblyman Ting,
to City Attorney David Chiu. Once we identify a path forward, such as banning cigarette filters or
categorizing cigarette litter in the EPR program, we will reach out for your support!



## **BottleBank Program**



The BottleBank program is an innovative CRV recycling program in San Francisco that uses specially made bags with barcodes that can be linked to customer accounts.

- 1. REGISTER: Download the app.
- 2. BAG IT: Collect beverage containers in the BottleBank blue bag. Available for free at the Marina and Embarcadero Safeway Bottle Bank Kiosks on Wednesdays between 9-4 PM
- 3. DROP OFF BAGS same time, same place
- 4. VALUE IT: You'll receive electronic notice of how much CRV you've earned within 72 hours
- 5. REDEEM IT: Link the app to your bank account or e-wallet.

### **Parks**



With monthly events, the Parks team installs native plants to feed our ecosystem, removes invasive plants, beautifies the neighborhood and supports local public school green spaces as ecosystem learning opportunities.

RHN selects native plants based on recommendations from the California Native Plant Society – Yerba Buena (San Francisco) (CNPS-YB) chapter.

We work with SF Parks&Rec. Dept., PUC on the Lombard Reservoir/Sterling Park and DPW to make the areas safe and more enjoyable.
